Why complete the survey?

- They contribute to changing course design and delivery

1. Indicate a response to each of the questions by clicking on the check boxes ranging from:


SD = Strongly Disagree

- 4. Deliver it at the right place and the right time






What happens next?

- Meaningful feedback leads to meaningful changes.
- Check out the Course Profiles, they show what students did like and didn't like about a course, as well as improvements made as a result.

An example:

"Three aspects of the course that received particularly positive evaluation were the clarity of the course objectives, the management and support of the course and the teaching methods, especially those related to the enhancement of knowledge and understanding.

One issue that students identified for improvement was the assessment criteria. To address this issue, the final project framework and task have been limited to give students a more concrete starting point and line of development..."
